

Who is Eligible?

1. Montgomery - Active Duty (Chapter 30)

Honorably discharged veterans who entered active duty after 07/01/85 and participated in the pay reduction program. Also, certain individuals having Vietnam Era GI Bill® eligibility who meets certain eligibility criteria may be eligible for the Chapter 30 program after 12/31/89.

2. Montgomery - Selected Reserves (Chapter 1606 and 1607 (REAP))

Reservists or National Guard Members, who enlisted, re-enlisted or extended an enlistment in the Selected Reserve or National Guard for a period of 6 years after 10/01/90. 1607 is payable if reservist meets consecutive active duty wartime service. Check with VA Office.

3. Dependents Education Assistance Program (Chapter 35)

A child or spouse of a veteran who died of a service-connected disability or has a total disability permanent in nature as a result from a service-connected disability.

4. Veterans Education Assistance Program (Chapter 32)

Those entering active duty between 01/01/77 and 06/30/85 and contributed toward the VEAP benefit. Check with VA Office.

5. Post-9/11 (Chapter 33)

Honorably discharged veteran who served at least 90 aggregate days or 30 days and discharged with a service-connected disability after 09/10/01. Effective 10/01/11.

Apprenticeship and On-the-Job Training

BACKGROUND

Various Public Laws provide for the payment of a monthly training allowance by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) for eligible persons pursuing a full-time on-the-job or apprenticeship program that is approved in Kansas by the Kansas State Approving Agency.

WHAT IS APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING

Apprenticeship training is on-the-job training coupled with theoretical related instruction. You receive your VA benefits while working full time and earning wages. Apprenticeship programs are normally for two years to five years in length. Although program registration with the Department of Labor - Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training (BAT) and Kansas State Apprenticeship Council is not mandatory for veteran's benefits, it is recommended in order to receive journey worker's papers upon successful completion. Some examples of approved apprenticeship programs are carpenter, electrician, plumber, sheet metal worker, fire-medic, machinist, and roofer.

WHAT IS ON-THE-JOB TRAINING

On-The-Job Training (OJT) is training you receive while actually performing a job and earning wages, as well as receiving VA benefits. OJT programs are normally from six months up to two years in length. Some examples of approvable OJT programs are welder, painter, cook, press operator, auto mechanic, and locksmith.

What are the Benefits?

The rates payable effective 10/01/16 are illustrated below:

If you are eligible under Chapter 30 (entered active duty after 07/01/85 and contributed to the Montgomery GI Bill®), your monthly allowance should be:

For those veterans whose initial obligated period of active duty was **three or more years**.

First 6 months	\$1,392.75
Second 6 months	\$1,021.35
Remainder of program	\$649.95

For those veterans whose initial obligated period of active duty was **less than three years**.

First 6 months	\$1,131.75
Second 6 months	\$829.95
Remaining training	\$528.15

If you are eligible under the Montgomery GI Bill® - Selected Reserves (Chapter 1606), your monthly allowance will be:

First 6 months	\$276.75
Second 6 months	\$202.95
Remainder of program	\$129.15

If you are eligible under Chapter 1607 (REAP), the amount of the monthly allowance is dependent upon the amount of consecutive service time (Active Duty) that you were ordered to wartime duty for.

Service of 2 years+

First 6 months	\$1,114.20
Second 6 months	\$817.08
Remaining pursuit	\$519.96

Service of 1 year +

First 6 months	\$835.65
Second 6 months	\$612.81
Remainder of pursuit	\$389.97

Service of 90 days but less than 1 year

First 6 months	\$557.80
Second 6 months	\$408.54
Remainder pursuit of training	\$259.98

If you are eligible under Chapter 35 (surviving spouse or child), your monthly allowance, as of

First 6 months	\$747.00
Second 6 months	\$561.00
Third 6 months	\$369.00
Remaining pursuit	\$188.00

If you were eligible under Chapter 34 (entered active duty between 02/01/55 and 12/31/76), you may be eligible to receive benefits under the Chapter 30 program. Contact the VA Regional Office in St. Louis for more specific information.

If you are eligible under Chapter 33 (Honorably discharged veteran who served at least 90 aggregate days or 30 days and discharged with a service-connected disability after 09/10/01), your monthly allowance should be:

- OJT / APP pay based on the housing rate of the employer's zip code multiplied by your benefit rating [applicable monthly housing allowance].
- 100% of the BAH rate for the first 6 months, 80% the next 6 months, 60% the next, 40% the next, then 20% thereafter.

Example at 100% eligibility rate:

City	<u>100%</u>	<u>80%</u>	<u>60%</u>	<u>40%</u>	<u>20%</u>
Dodge City	\$1131.00	\$904.80	\$678.60	\$452.40	\$226.20
Kansas City	\$1368.00	\$1094.40	\$820.80	\$547.20	\$273.60
Salina	\$1185.00	\$948.00	\$711.00	\$472.80	\$237.00

Example at 60% eligibility rate:

City	<u>100%</u>	<u>80%</u>	<u>60%</u>	<u>40%</u>	<u>20%</u>
Dodge City	\$678.60	\$542.88	\$407.16	\$271.44	\$135.72
Kansas City	\$820.80	\$656.64	\$492.48	\$328.32	\$164.16
Salina	\$711.00	\$568.80	\$426.60	\$284.40	\$142.20

You may also be eligible for an equipment allowance of up to \$83/month for apprenticeship programs.
